

My plants are propagated personally from seed and cuttings from my own garden. The nursery set-up is designed to be light on resources and encourage natural predators, reducing the input of pesticides to almost zero. I use only peat-free compost. The plants are grown-on in open ground which makes them robust and used to being outside summer and winter.
